PART I: Making the Economic Case for Community Energy Plans

Communities just starting out (no CEP) - discussion focused on developing plans

What are the approaches you are considering taking in your business case? Emissions reductions? Job creation? Efficiency?

Communities that are part of PCP but plans do not focus on energy – discussion focused on the energy gaps in the current planning framework

- What are the barriers to quantifying the intangible benefits?
- What are some ideas/examples of how people have quantified things that are not as obvious (e.g. energy savings are obvious, but how do you make the intangibles tangible)?

Communities currently implementing PCP plans and/or CEPs – discussion is focused on implementation challenges and solutions

For those who have already established a business case for their CEP, how did you modify the case as you moved forward?

Part 2: Normalizing Community Energy Plans as regular municipal business

Communities just starting out (no CEP) - discussion focused on developing plans

- What are the corporate priorities or related community initiatives that you can leverage to kick-start a conversation about the role of energy in your community? (e.g. environmental plan, update to an OP/MDP/CP etc., utility regional energy plan)
- What funding avenues are available to you to support the development of a CEP? (e.g. GMF, Ontario Municipal Energy Plan Program, Utility programs)
- What opportunities have you identified to build momentum and interest within your community? (e.g. inviting key stakeholders interested in energy issues together for an informal meeting)
